Community Vaccination Clinics (Mass Immunization Clinics)

Open to all Ottawa residents 60 and older (born in or before 1961), **or** residents 50 and older (born in or before 1971) in “hot spots” with postal codes that begin with K1T, K1V and K2V.

Appointments are currently available at four community vaccination clinics:

- Nepean Sportsplex
- Ruddy Family YMCA-YWCA
- Eva James Memorial Community Centre
- City Hall

Daily hours of operation at all four community clinics:

- First appointment 8:15 am
- Last appointment 9:15 pm
- *Hours of operation are dependent on supply*

Pop-up Clinics

Four new pop-up clinics are opening. The pop-up clinic locations were strategically selected to provide overall geographic coverage and proximity to the high-priority neighbourhoods identified by OPH.

Appointments will be available from April 16 to April 30.

Each location can accommodate 400-600 immunizations per day and operate multiple days in a row, subject to vaccine supply availability.

Please note, most clinics have been filled. Limited appointments remain for the AMA Centre and Routhier Community Centre clinics.

Pop-up clinic communications:

- These clinics are not being promoted widely as we are focusing our efforts on direct outreach to the priority neighbourhoods.
- The City will communicate to the wider public if there continues to be availability.

Mobile Vaccination Teams

- Mobile vaccination teams are providing vaccinations in congregate settings, including shelters.
- **Homebound residents:** OPH is actively working with health partners including Community Health Centres (CHCs) to support in-home vaccination of homebound health-care recipients. Eligible recipients will be contacted to book an in-home vaccination. Currently, homebound health-care recipients are the only group eligible for in-home vaccination. Once vaccines have been provided to everyone in this group, OPH will work with its partners to identify other homebound residents.

Indigenous Clinics

- OPH and Wabano Centre for Aboriginal Health are providing vaccines to First Nation, Inuit and Métis community members 16+
 - Clinic is located at St-Laurent Complex, 525 Côté Street

- Akausivik Inuit Family Health Team is providing vaccines to *all* Inuit adults.

- Special Education teachers will be contacted directly for vaccinations, which began this week. The date, time and location of the appointment will be provided by email.
